Re: Racial Equity Report Card

It has been seven years since we published our first report on racial equity. We publish this data to be transparent and to show our progress on racial equity at the City in the areas of employment, criminal justice, and number of complaints based on race received by the Human Rights Office alleging discrimination in the community. The report card spotlights where we were in 2015 and compares that to where we were in 2019 (2019 reflects the most recent data the City has in these areas). The report card has been modified from last year's version to display the actual data.

The report card is derived from three reports: the Human Rights Commission's Annual Report, the Police Department's Annual Reports and the Employee Statistics Report. All three reports are hyperlinked on the report card.
